In the near future, a weary Logan cares for an ailing Professor X in a hide-out on the Mexican border. But Logan's attempts to hide from the world and his legacy are upended when a young mutant arrives, being pursued by dark forces.

Film director and fashion designer Tom Ford ("A Single Man") writes and directs this adaptation of Austin Wright's 1993 novel "Tony and Susan." Oscar®-nominee Amy Adams stars as Susan Morrow, a woman who unexpectedly receives a book manuscript from her ex-husband, who she left decades earlier. Susan becomes captivated by the fictional thriller, which centres on a character named Tony Hastings (Oscar®-nominee Jake Gyllenhaal) whose family vacation is marred by violence. The manuscript forces Susan to re-examine her relationship with her ex-husband. Michael Shannon, Isla Fisher and Armie Hammer also star.

But things go from bad to worse when he accidentally crosses his much tougher and deeply feared colleague, Ron Strickland (Ice Cube), who challenges Campbell to an old-fashioned throwdown after school. News of the fight spreads like wildfire and ends up becoming the very thing this school, and Campbell, needed.

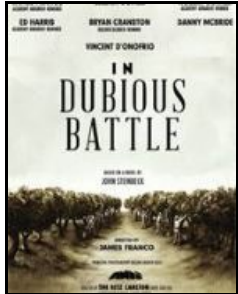
5/ Personal Shopper
