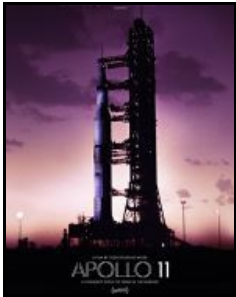
1/ Dark Phoenix

Adventure, SciFi / 2019 / Dir. Simon Kinberg

During a life-threatening mission to outer space, Jean Grey is nearly killed when she absorbs a cosmic entity that leaves her with powers far beyond anything she or any other mutant has ever possessed. Once she returns home to Earth, she struggles with these near-godlike abilities, but the force inside her is too overwhelming to contain. Spiraling out of control, Jean hurts the ones she loves most. Her actions tear the X-Men apart, and the heroes find themselves deeply compromised at a time when they must face their most dangerous enemy yet - one of their own.

2/ Apollo 11

From director Todd Douglas Miller (Dinosaur 13) comes a cinematic event fifty years in the making. Crafted from a newly discovered trove of 65mm footage, and more than 11,000 hours of uncatalogued audio recordings, "Apollo 11" takes us straight to the heart of NASA's most celebrated mission - the one that first put men on the moon, and forever made Neil Armstrong and Buzz Aldrin into household names. Immersed in the perspectives of the astronauts, the team in Mission Control, and the millions of spectators on the ground, we vividly experience those momentous days and hours in 1969 when humankind took a giant leap into the future.

3/ Pet Semetary

Based on the seminal horror novel by Stephen King, Pet Semetary follows Dr. Louis Creed (Jason Clarke), who, after relocating with his wife Rachel (Amy Seimetz) and their two young children from Boston to rural Maine, discovers a mysterious burial ground hidden deep in the woods near the family's new home. When tragedy strikes, Louis turns to his unusual neighbor, Jud Crandall (John Lithgow), setting off a perilous chain reaction that unleashes an unfathomable evil with horrific consequences.

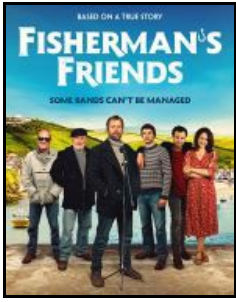
4/ Us

Thriller, Horror / 2019 / Dir. Jordan Peele

Academy Award winner Jordan Peele, the acclaimed filmmaker behind "Get Out," returns to write, direct and produce "Us," a socially-conscious horror film starring Oscar winner Lupita Nyong'o, Winston Duke, Elisabeth Moss, and Tim Heidecker. Set along the Northern California coastline, the original thriller follows Adelaide (Nyong'o), her husband Gabe (Duke), and their two children (Shahadi Wright Joseph, Evan Alex) on a summer getaway that takes a nightmarish turn when they encounter terrifying doppelgängers of themselves.

5/ Fishermans Friends

In a twist of fate, cynical music executive Danny finds himself in a small Cornish village trying to sign a group of shanty-singing fishermen. Attempting to overcome the fishermen's skepticism about the music business he finds himself drawn into the community, has his integrity tested, and ultimately is shown the meaning of loyalty, love, and friendship. This heartwarming comedy is inspired by the true story of Port Isaac's Fishermen's Friends who went from singing in the village harbor to a deal with Island Records, a top-ten album, and performing on the pyramid stage at Glastonbury.

To the shock of his wife and school chancellor, and the delight of his students, Richard leads a hilarious crusade against authority and hypocrisy in this dark comedy.

There, while being pursued by the local Sheriff (David Strathairn), she begins to mend the broken relationships with her mother (Lorraine Toussaint) and daughter (Saniyya Sidney) and learns that the power she needed was inside her all along.

Withdrawn after the death of her mother, young New Yorker Frances befriends a lonely older French woman named Greta after finding and returning her lost handbag. However, their meeting proves to be anything but accidental and Frances must psychologically outmanoeuvre the obsessed Greta after being drawn into her twisted web.
